

Restroom Policy

Redemption Policy

Redemption Plan

A plan to address students' lack of TEKS mastery, can be addressed by individual assignment, or recovery of a 9-week or final. Teachers will update grades based on assignments displaying growth of mastery.

Fall Finals - Grade Redemption

Jan 16th - Feb 2nd - the 3-week window to take any Fall semester exams to students who missed it.

Semester 1 - Grade Redemption

Create a redemption plan with you teachers of courses you failed first semester. All grade changes due by Feb 5th.

Failing Assessments and Projects Throughout the 9 Weeks - Grade Redemption

See your teacher to discuss options immediately after receiving the failing grades.

Campus Safety

Students

Campus Safety Continued

New Tardy Procedures



- No tardy slips will be issued if you are late to class.
- Teachers will now mark students tardy in attendance. Students will still get consequences for accruing tardies including lunch detention, after school detention, Saturday School and ISS.
- 10 minutes after classes start, students who are not in classes will be brought to ISS for the remainder of the class period, and parents will be contacted.


Attendance

GET COLLEGE READY with TSI THURSDAYS!

The TSI Assessment (TSIA) is part of the Texas Success Initiative program designed to determine if you are ready for college-level course work in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics. If you'd like to take college courses while in high school or plan to go to college or university after you graduate, you are required to take the TSI Assessment - unless you are already exempt. The TSIA2 consists of three examinations – Mathematics, English Language Arts and Reading (ELAR), and Essay.

TSI testing occurs every Thursday:

- Underclassmen (9th & 10th graders) will test in the Library's Writing Lab
- Upperclassmen (11th & 12th graders) will test in the College & Career Center (#343)
