Founded in 1965, Northeast is a public high school located in northeast Austin, with a strong alumni community and a long tradition of Raider pride, including three state football championships.

Through a partnership with Austin Community College, Northeast students can earn a General Studies associate degree while in high school. The campus also offers a Pathways in Technology Early College High School program leading to a Network Administration Level 1 Certificate, with opportunities for industry certifications, career-based learning, and internships with Dell Technologies. Students earn college credit at no cost.

Northeast students often balance high school and college coursework with responsibilities outside of school, including part-time jobs, caregiving, and translating or interpreting for family members. These responsibilities are an important part of the context in which many students pursue their academic and career goals.

Raider pride extends beyond academics. The band regularly earns awards at regional and UIL competitions, while fine arts programs include theater, dance, guitar, and orchestra, with large-scale theater productions throughout the year. Raider athletics also have a strong tradition of success, including a boys soccer program that advanced to the state finals and competitive programs in basketball, track and field, cross country, tennis, and other sports.

Foundation + Endorsement – 26 cr

Foundation + Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) – 26 cr

Core Requirements for DLA:

- 4 years of English
- 4 years of Math (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II)
- 4 years of Science
- 3 years of Social Studies
- 2 years of a language other than English (Spanish or Korean)
- 1 year Fine Arts and Physical Education
- 4.5 credits Electives/Endorsement coursework

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

Students engage in hands-on, project-based CTE programs that prepare them for success in college, career, and life. The five career clusters are available:

- **Business, Entrepreneurship, and Finance**
- **Automotive Repair and Collision**
- **Audio/Visual Production**
- **Professional Communication**
- **Cybersecurity**

Students may also participate in the Clifton Career Development School, a centralized AISD program offering six programs of study with classroom instruction, labs, and internships.
